Explanatory notes:

There is no grading system for the courses, lectures, and practical training units (cp. footnote 4). State examinations are held upon completion of each part of the education. They are written, oral, or both, and a grade is conferred according to the overall performance, (average of all tested subjects). Grades conferred are

- 1 – „sehr gut“ = outstanding performance, ~90–100%
 - 2 – „gut“ = far above average performance, ~80–89%
 - 3 – „befriedigend“ = good but with shortcomings, ~70–79%
 - 4 – „ausreichend“ = performance meets minimum criteria, ~60–69%
- _____ failing grades are:
- 5 „mangelhaft“ = fail ~ 50%-59%
